

## CALIFORNIA COUNTIES APPROVED ONLINE BLOODBORNE PATHOGENS & INFECTION CONTROL COURSE FOR BODY ART PROFESSIONALS IN COMPLIANCE SAFE BODY ACT (AB 300)



This course provides body art industry specific training in compliance with the OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Standard 29 CFR 1910.1030, CalOSHA's Blood borne Pathogens Standard Section 5193 of title 8 CCR, and California's Safe Body Art Act AB 300, H & S Section 119307. This course work is designed by an experienced infectious disease professional with 15 years of experience working with body art industry and public health. Material covered in this comprehensive 3 hours course (minimum 2 hours required by law) provides body art industry specific information on bloodborne pathogens and other highly contagious skin infections/communicable diseases.

### Upon completion of this course, you will be able to learn:

- The purpose of OSHA Bloodborne Pathogens Standard 29 CFR 1910.1030, CalOSHA's Bloodborne Pathogens Standard Section 5193, Title 8 CCR ( <http://www.dir.ca.gov/title8/5193.html> ) , California Health & Safety Code Section 119307, how it applies to the body art industry, and need for blood-borne pathogens & infection control training for body art professionals.
- Medical issues associated with body art industry.
- How cross contamination and contact transmission occurs in body art shops.
- Bloodborne pathogens (HIV, Hepatitis B virus, Hepatitis C virus) & selected communicable diseases (Hepatitis A, Staphylococcus aureus infections, including MRSA, Tuberculosis, Impetigo, Scabies, Ringworm, Molluscum Contagiosum, Herpes Simplex, and Herpes Zoster)
  - ⇒ Identification of the disease
  - ⇒ Description of the infectious agent
  - ⇒ Mode of transmission
  - ⇒ Incubation period
  - ⇒ Period of communicability
  - ⇒ Prevention of transmission in the tattoo establishment
- Know the minimum operational requirements (sanitary and safety requirements) related to the design and operation of tattoo establishments, and temporary establishments.
- Know the Standard Precautions and available PPE to prevent transmission of bloodborne pathogens & common skin infections.
- Know the basics of infection control, hand hygiene, sterilization by autoclave, and aseptic techniques used to prevent disease transmission in the body art establishments.
- Information on Hepatitis B Vaccination, including safety and accessibility
- Signs, label & color coding
- Supply storage and chemical labeling
- BBP exposure incidents, and know the steps to take following an exposure incident.
